\$40,000 AWARDED IN GRANTS TO HELP HURON COUNTY THRIVE

The Huron County Community Foundation (HCCF) is improving our community with \$40,000 of grant-making power. At a Board of Directors meeting in September, the Board voted to award a total of \$40,000 to 10 area organizations. Projects awarded fill critical needs, create opportunities for our young people, and contribute to a thriving community.

The largest grant awarded was \$10,000 to the Feichtner Memorial Youth Livestock Complex, as they continue raising money for a project that will benefit youth and spur economic development. Other highlights included support for a county-wide 2-1-1 program that connects people to essential health and human services 24 hours a day. speech therapy for preschoolers, job support for formerly incarcerated individuals, and funding to local food banks.

The HCCF Board of Directors has identified priorities around the youth of the community, whether that be the food that nourishes them and their families or offering art and cultural experiences to expand their world view.

Over the summer, a series called "Raising the Bar" was held at the new BGSU Resort & Attraction Management School in downtown Sandusky. Hosted in collaboration between the Huron (HCCF) and Erie County Community Foundations, the goal was to better equip nonprofits with the tools to help them raise money and be sustainable organizations.

The classes were taught by regional experts and covered the topics of:

- Grant Writing Basics
- Fundraising 101
- Government Grants
- Major Gifts

Over 80 unique individuals registered to attend, and every class except for one was "sold out" (classes were offered free of charge). Proving skills courses like this are needed, nonprofit leaders reported being energized by the conversation and asked for continued classes in the areas of board governance, marketing, and other topics. We're looking

forward to bringing this back next summer, stay tuned.
