HURON COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION PRESENTS AREA NONPROFITS OVER \$19,000 IN COMMUNITY GRANTS AT COMMUNITY BREAKFAST

Norwalk, Ohio, April 28, 2023 – Huron County Community Foundation Board of Directors today presented over \$19,000 in charitable community grants to several Huron County non-profits and schools. The Community Foundation hosted a breakfast for the grantees at the Huron County Chamber of Commerce in Norwalk. Projects awarded fill critical needs, create opportunities for youth, and further contribute to a thriving community.

The Huron County Community Foundation Board of Directors identified priorities around the youth of the community, whether that be the food that nourishes them and their families or offering art and cultural experiences to expand their world view.

Organizations and Projects Awarded in the 2023 Round 1 Grants Cycle

- Hope Restored, abuse prevention program providing CarePacks to domestic violence victims & their children, \$3,000
- Norwalk Area United Fund, Huron County Imagination Library, providing free, age-appropriate books to children aged 0 to 5 years, \$2,500
- Starting Point Outreach Center, Life Skills for Teens, expanding and enhancing programming for minority and disadvantaged teens to build skills in the areas of healthy living, academic success, life skills, and community service, \$1,750
- Bellevue City Schools, Certified Academic Language Practitioner (CALP) Training, providing training in structured literacy, addressing high percentages of students reading below expectations, and providing compliance with Ohio HB 436, \$2,400
- Bellevue Society for the Arts, sponsorship of teen theater production of Disney's Mary Poppins \$1,600
- Ronald McDonald House Charities of Central Ohio, Helping Hands Huron County, supporting a home-away-from-home for Huron County families requiring medical care in central Ohio, \$2,500
- Christian Day Nursery School, Outdoor Learning, creating an outdoor environment for children to explore what nature has to offer through hands-on experiences, \$1,500
- South Central Local Schools, AED Access Expansion, making AEDs accessible to during major school gatherings, events, and to our traveling sports teams, \$2,000
- Citizens Ambulance Service, Training Room Update, Seating and display updates to the community education room, \$1,000



• Willard Community Improvement Corporation, Willard Dog Park, providing a safe environment for exercise and socialization of dogs and owners at no cost, \$766.53
